

Recycle all kinds of Residential Light Bulbs Rescheduled to March 2 and 3, 2025

Recycle these bulbs for free:

- compact fluorescents (CFLs)
- incandescent
- halogen
- light emitting diodes (LEDs)
- Christmas lights

Recycle these mercury-containing bulbs **for a fee**

that passes directly to the companies that extract mercury, a complicated procedure for processing hazardous materials. **Cash only, please.**

- florescent and LED tubes (1-ft-4-ft)—\$1/tube
- florescent and LED tubes (5-ft-8-ft)--\$2/tube
- projector--\$8/bulb
- High Intensity Discharge bulbs (including metal halide)—\$3/bulb



We do not accept broken bulbs.

To safely transport CFLs, LEDs, and metal halide bulbs, seal each one in a zip-lock bag, one per bag.

To prevent accidental breakage, transport florescent or LED tubes in the box the new ones came in (you can take your box back home) or carefully and securely wrap them in newspaper or other protective material to prevent them from sliding out.

For safety, we cannot store bulbs in the church at any other time so please drop them off only Sunday, February 16, 9:15-9:40 a.m. or the following Wednesday, February 19, 9:30-11:30 a.m.

SUMC is located east of the square on Hwy. MO-32 at the intersection of Hwy. J

Follow signs and arrows to the SUMC east portico for a Go Green Team volunteer to safely collect your bulbs from your trunk or back seat. Please stay in your car and do not unload them yourself.
